



DISCIPLINES FOR END-TIME DISCIPLES

1. Without giving excuses, spend time every day studying the Word of God, praying and cleansing your heart, worshipping God. Study and meditate on good Christian literature and materials that will prepare you for eternity also.
2. Get rid of sin that we are so easily prone to like lust, anger, pride, love of money, materialism, vanities, worldliness, fear, worry, anxiety, doubt, unbelief, unforgiving spirit, ungodly jesting and careless talking that makes it so easy to commit sin and so difficult to live a holy life.
3. Practice solitude and quietness from time to time. This means you should withdraw from the world around you as often as possible and spend quality time in God's presence.
4. If you don't want to go to hell, don't make your job an excuse for not daily seeking God and spending time with Him. Re-prioritize and rearrange your time accordingly, cutting off all unnecessary things for maximum spiritual impact. If all of these are impossible, then trust God to change your job at all costs, so that it will not lead you to hell; for what shall it profit a man, if he gains the whole world and loses his soul (Mark 8: 36)..
5. Be faithful to God in your finances – tithes, offerings, pledges, vows and arms regularly.

6. Avoid working or buying and selling on Sundays as much as possible unless it is urgent and absolutely inevitable.
7. Don't go late to church. Don't make phone calls or be chatting while service is going on. Give your total attention to God and to the service while you are in church. The Lord takes these issues very seriously and many Christians are failing in these areas.
8. Repent, restitute where necessary and run away from every sin that could easily beset you as a Christian. Such sins include envy, gossip, slander, selfishness, stealing, lying and exaggeration, all forms of dishonesty, cheating and fraud, false declarations, unfulfilled promises, unforgiveness and malice. We could take these things for granted and forget that God takes note and they could prevent us from making heaven except we genuinely repent of such sins.
9. Don't be stubborn to always defend your wrongs. Don't resent correction or see anybody who corrects and reproofs you as your enemy.
10. Set high standards for yourself and judge yourself daily! Examine yourself in line with Scripture, listen to the Holy Spirit within and promptly effect all necessary changes in genuine and total repentance. Don't grieve or quench the Holy Spirit through disobedience so He will not stop speaking to you. Amend your ways after being taught, reproved and corrected. That's the way to spiritual growth and making heaven. Don't take the fact that God is blessing and using you for granted to assume that your life is right with Him. God causes His rain to fall on both the righteous and the wicked, and His gifts and calling are without repentance (Romans 11: 29).
