B. What is Christian Service?

- ✓ A Christian attending to something or someone.
- ✓ Work done by a Christian for God.
- ✓ Work done by a Christian to meet specific needs in the church in particular and society in general.
- Things done to ensure that the church functions properly and effectively as God's agent in the society.

C. What Work Requires:

Every work has its requirements. The worker therefore must know the requirements of the work before he starts. Some of these requirements are listed as follows:

STUDY FIVE: CO-LABOURERS WITH GOD

A. What is Labour?

- i. To Toil
- ii. To Work Hard
- iii. Exertion of Physical, mental or spiritual energy to accomplish a task for God.

A **Labourer** therefore is anyone who does any of the three things above.

B. God Labours

- i. He worked continuously for six days to create the heaven and the earth Gen. 2:1-3.
- ii. God resumed back to work after He rested on the seventh day Gen. 3:9-24.
- **iii. He has since been working** Ps. 34:19; 68:19; 103:3; Isa. 45:1, 2; Jn. 5:17; 15:1, 2; Matt. 5:45.
- iv. Without sleep or slumber Ps. 91:3, 4; 104:27; 121:3.
- v. The sermons and passion of Christ are examples of God's Labour Matt.5: 1-46; 15: 32; Lk. 22:39 46; 23:1 46.

C. Man As A Co-labourer With God – 1 Cor. 3:9

- i. God placed man in the garden to tend it Gen. 2:15
- ii. Tending the garden is an enormous task Jn. 15:1, 2.
- iii. Every assignment God gives is enormous Matt.9: 37

Examples of co-labourers with God are:

STUDY SIX: TIMES AND SEASONS OF LIFE - I

A. What is Time?

- 1. A measurable period during which an action or condition exists or continues.
- 2. A moment, occasion or period used, available or suitable for something.

B. What is Season?

- 1. Part of the year or lifetime distinguished by its particular type of weather or peculiarities.
- 2. Period when something is easily available or certain activities take place.

C. Facts About Times And Seasons

- 1. God made times and seasons Gen. 1: 14.
- 2. Measurement of times and seasons: Gen.8: 22; Rev.1: 11; 21: 6.
 - i. Years, Months, Weeks, Days, Hours, Minutes, Seconds, Microseconds and Nanoseconds.
 - ii. Seedtime (Planting seasons), Harvest-time, Summer & Winter, Day & Night, Beginning & End.
 - iii. Every Bird and Animal Species also has its breeding seasons.
 - iv. There are also certain moments of divine visitation in a believer's life too
- 3. **Man dwells in the realm of time but God dwells in eternity** Gen. 6: 3; Ps.90: 4,10; Pro.8: 23; 2Pet.3: 8; Isa.57: 15; Jer.10: 10.

D. Stages of Life -

i. Early Morning – Ages 0 – 6 years.

Peculiar Traits: Childhood, Start of Life, Very Fresh, Innocent, Naïve, Tender, Trusting, Dependent, Humble, Teachable and Malleable.

ii. Mid-Morning – Ages 7 – 12yrs.

Peculiar Traits: Active, Develops Personality, Self-Assertive, Self-Discovery, Full of Struggles, Curious and Adventurous.

iii. Noon – Ages 13 – 19yrs.

Peculiar Traits: Volatile, Vibrant, Confused, Secretive, Assertive, Adventurous, and Gullible.

iv. Afternoon - Ages 20 - 50 years.

Peculiar Traits: Proud, Struggle, Productive, Agile, Mobile, Defensive, Responsible, Self-Confident, Self-Actualized, Territorial, Competitive and Ambitious.

v. Evening - Ages 51 - 75yrs.

Peculiar Traits: Consolidation, Fulfilled, Secured, Relaxed, Sedentary, Pampering.

vi. Night – Ages 75yrs & above.

Peculiar Traits: Experienced, Old, Grounded, Forgetful, Strong-Willed, Fearless, Pampering, Childlike, Story Telling, Nostalgic, Valedictory & Often, Vindictive.

- 4. All the six stages of life can also be grouped into three stages. They are:
 - i. Childhood (Formative & Foundational Stage) 1Cor.13:
 11. Examples are: Joseph, Moses, Samuel, David, Josiah, Timothy.
 - ii. Adulthood (Peak Of Life) 1Cor.14: 20. Examples are: Joseph, Moses, David & Jesus Jn.9: 4; Eccl.12: 1.
 - iii. Old Age (Retirement Stage) Josh.13: 1; Ps. 37: 25; 71: 18. Examples are: Joshua, Zechariah & Thief on the cross.

Note: The peak of life is between 20 & 60 years when man is at his best – Eccl.12: 1-7. It is the most productive phase of life when men either succeed or fail.

- C. However, this can not be so if we don't understand the times and seasons of life and make the best use of them 1Chron.12: 32; Ps.32: 9.

A. What Are Tools?

Tools are implements, instruments or equipment used for carrying out particular tasks.

B. God Equips Us To Work For Him – Matt.25: 14-18; Rom.12: 6; 1Cor.12: 11; Eph.4: 7, 11-18; Jas.1: 17.

C. What Are The Tools Of God In The Life Of A Believer?

Tools are God's provision for the discharge of Christian Service. These comprise of our Gifts, Talents, Money, Grace, Gender, Position, Privileges and Rights, Goodwill, Opportunities, etc. They could be natural or spiritual. Some are primary, others secondary and even, tertiary.

- E. Primary Tools These Are The Fundamental Tools of Life.
